Fear is fear and it can be very frightening, even paralysing. At the moment people are afraid to go out. Many parents tell me, that their children are afraid to go out. People are afraid of hospitals, even to go for a routine checkup. Fear of an operation, fear of exams, or no exams. Fear of dying.

Many parallels with today's readings. The apostles are locked in the room, for fear of the Jews. They are probably also afraid of Jesus and recriminations.

They had abandoned Him at the time of his death. One of them had turned him over to the authorities. Another had denied he even knew Jesus. The others ran away, apparently in fear. That same fear still gripped them and the disciples stayed behind locked doors, like many of us now.

Suddenly the risen Jesus appears among them, and there is not a word about their betrayal, denial, and abandonment.

"Peace be with you," he says, as though nothing had ever happened.

They look at his wounds, and he repeats his remarkable greeting: "Peace be with you." If only we could follow in the footsteps of Christ and wish peace to everyone! If only we could forgive as he forgave! Where would be the wars, the discrimination, the hatred, the death penalty?

They would go the way of death itself, conquered by the resurrection.

Jesus assures us that we have received the Holy Spirit.

We have the power to forgive others of their read it...reflectively. wrongs against us, just as we have the power to keep them and ourselves in bondage.

As an Easter people we have become a New Creation and clothed ourselves in Christ.
