Pope Francis has told a group of young French social activists that only their generation can bring about much needed change in the world because those who are old don't understand how to do so.

"Start a revolution, shake things up. The world is deaf; you have to open its ears," the pope told the three during a 45-minute private meeting on March 15 at his Vatican residence. The trio included environmental activist, Cyril Dion, and entrepreneur, Eva Sadoun. The third person was Samuel Grzybowski, the founder of Coexister, an interfaith youth-based movement that promotes peaceful coexistence. The meeting with the pope was requested by Pierre Larrouturou, a member of the European Parliament, who had intended to share with Francis his proposal for a tax on financial transactions. But Larrouturou was forced to back out at the last moment when he tested positive for the coronavirus.
