'An environmentally sustainable lifestyle'

In his September prayer intention Pope Francis invites us to pray that everyone might make choices which promote a simple and sustainable lifestyle.

"It makes me very happy to see that young people have the courage to undertake projects for environmental and social improvement, since the two go together," he said. Pope Francis added that adults can learn much from young people, since they are often at the forefront of issues "related to care for the planet."

"Let us take advantage of their example and reflect on our lifestyle, especially during these moments of health, social and environmental crisis." he said.

We should take the opportunity to reflect on "the way we eat, consume, travel, or the way we use water, energy, plastics, and many other material goods, especially those which are harmful to the environment".

"Let us choose to change!" the Pope urged. "Let us advance with young people towards lifestyles that are simpler and more respectful of the environment and let us pray that we all will make courageous choices".
