**The World Day for Migrants and Refugees 2022** First celebrated in 1914, **The World Day for Migrants and Refugees 2022 (WDMR)** is an *International Day of Prayer* which offers an occasion to express concern for different vulnerable people on the move; to pray for them in the challenges they face; and to increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers. This year, it will be celebrated on 25 September 2022, and both the <u>Bishops' Conference</u> and the <u>Vatican</u> have websites dedicated to Migrants and Refugees.

Pope Francis' theme for this year's WDMR is **"Building the Future with Migrants and Refugees."** The Holy Father asks us to proclaim the message that full citizenship of God's Kingdom does not exclude those most vulnerable, as we recognize the value each of them can bring to the process of construction.
