If receiving in the hand, please ensure your hands are clean, that one hand is laid flat upon the other, and that you place the Sacred Host in your mouth in front of the priest before returning to your seat. Those who are not Roman Catholics, or are not in a position to receive Holy Communion at this time, may present themselves for a blessing by crossing their arms in front of their chest.
