9. At the same time, Bartholomew has drawn attention to the ethical and spiritual roots of environmental problems, which require that we look for solutions not only in technology but in a change of humanity; otherwise we would be dealing merely with symptoms. He asks us to replace consumption with sacrifice, greed with generosity, wastefulness with a spirit of sharing, an asceticism which "entails learning to give, and not simply to give up. It is a way of loving, of moving gradually away from what I want to what God's world needs. It is liberation from fear, greed and compulsion".17 As Christians, we are also called "to accept the world as a sacrament of communion, as a way of sharing with God and our neighbours on a global scale. It is our humble conviction that the divine and the human meet in the slightest detail in the seamless garment of God's creation, in the last speck of dust of our planet".

It is never too late to be what you might have been.

New Archbishop of Southwark John Wilson was born in Sheffield in 1968, he studied Theology at the University of Leeds and for the priesthood at the Venerable English College in Rome. He was ordained on 29 July 1995 for the Diocese of Leeds. He taught moral theology at St Cuthbert's Seminary, Durham and then served as Vice-Rector. He completed a PhD at Durham University and was appointed Episcopal Vicar for Evangelisation in the Diocese of Leeds. He was also sessional chaplain at HMP Leeds. In 2011 he was named a Chaplain to His Holiness by Pope Benedict XVI. During the vacancy of the See, he was elected Administrator of the Diocese of Leeds and from 2015 to 2016 he served as Parish Priest of St Martin de Porres in Wakefield.

On 24 November 2015 he was appointed an Auxiliary Bishop in the Archdiocese of Westminster and Titular Bishop of Lindisfarne by Pope Francis. He was ordained to the episcopate by Cardinal Vincent Nichols on the Feast of the Conversion of St Paul, 25 January 2016 and was appointed Archbishop of Southwark by Pope Francis on the retirement of Archbishop Peter Smith. His installation will take place in St George's Cathedral, Southwark, on 25 July 2019 at 11am, the Feast of St James the Apostle. All are welcome.
