John Henry Newman

1. God has created me to do him some definite service; he has committed some work to me which he has not committed to another.

I have my mission; I never may know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next.

I have a part in a great work; I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught.

I shall do good, I shall do His work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it, if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling.

2. Fear not that life shall come to an end, but rather fear that it shall never have a beginning.

3. I sought to hear the voice of God and climbed the topmost steeple, but God declared: "Go down again – I dwell among the people."

4. A cloud of incense was rising on high; the people suddenly all bowed low; what could it mean? The truth flashed on him, fearfully yet sweetly; it was the Blessed Sacrament – it was the Lord Incarnate who was on the altar, who had come to visit and bless his people. It was the Great Presence, which makes a Catholic Church different from every other place in the world; which makes it, as no other place can be – holy.
